in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in *Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.*

All that certain parcel or tract of land lying and being in Butler Township, County and State aforesaid, and having the following metes and bounds, and being, according to a plat made by William A. Hudson, August 28, 1906, which said plat is recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book C, page 136, metes and bounds, to wit:

Beginning at a stone on the south side of public road and running thence S. 44° 21' 17.65 to a stone on said road, thence S. 44° 21' 23.80 to stone; thence N. 44° 21' 17.65 to a stone, thence N. 44° 21' 24.0 to stone, the point of beginning, being bounded on the West by land of J. Lee Greene; on the South by land of J. L. Bravett; on the East by land of L. L. Bravett, and on the north by land of D. L. Johnson, containing forty two (42) acres, more or less, and being the same tract of land, willed to Emily L. Potest by her mother, Emily M. Cole.

Being the same parcel or tract of land conveyed to Ora L. Finlay by Alexander Finlay by deed dated April 2, 1931, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deeds Volume 161 at page 3.

Also being the same tract of land conveyed to Alexander Finlay by the heirs at law of the late Ora L. Finlay in a division of real estate, by deed from P. P. Edwards, F. M. Edwards, J. L.
