G. P. Brissay,  
A one-seventh undivided interest in and to all that certain  
piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being on Trade Street  
in the Town of Greer, Greenville County, State of South Carolina,  
being known and designated as Lot No. Nine upon a plat made  
by W. L. Reeves of the Public Square of the Town of Greer, said plat  
being recorded in Plat Book E at page 10, R. M. C. office for Greenville  
County, and being the same lot of land conveyed to J. J. Miller  
by deed of the Town of Greer as recorded in said County in  
Deed Book 33 at page 248.

Also, a one-seventh undivided interest in and to all that cer-  
tain piece, parcel or tract of land containing Twenty and one  
half ( $20\frac{1}{2}$ ) acres, more or less, situate, lying and being near  
the Town of Greer, in Beech Springs Township, Spartanburg County,  
State of South Carolina, and bounded by the lands of Tom Land  
mon, W. P. Denney, W. R. Baileys and others, and being known  
as the Home Place of J. J. Miller, deceased, and lying on the  
North side of the S. C. Apalachee road between Greer and  
Apalache Mill.

Also, a one-seventh undivided interest in and to a certain  
group of lots situate, lying and being near the Town of Greer,  
in Beech Springs Township, Spartanburg County, State of South  
Carolina, known and designated as Lots Nos. 1, 2 and 3 in  
Block H on a plat of land known as "Dillworth Park" ac-
