BY THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.

WHEREAS, Broadus Bailey and W. W. Ellis, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 21st day of January, 1932, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Basal Laboratories, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to manufacture, sell and otherwise dispose of a commercial cleaner known as Basal. To engage in the manufacture, sale and distribution of commercial cleaners, soaps, detergents, disinfectants and other chemicals and chemical compounds, to do any and all things incidental to the carrying on of said business, and generally to transact all business as may be permitted under the existing law, or which may hereafter be conferred upon such corporations by law.

Published Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution of the State of South Carolina, the amount of the capital stock is \$1000.00 One Thousand and no/100ths

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Ten Thousand Dollars,

payable in cash or such equivalent as shall be acceptable to the Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred (100) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 14th day of January, 1932, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy were elected directors: Broadus Bailey and W. W. Ellis

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Broadus Bailey as Vice-President, W. W. Ellis as Secretary, W. W. Ellis as Treasurer.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter L, Article I of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
