all that place, parcel or lot of land in Pineville,

Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina,

containing 77 acres more or less, it being a part of the
J. L. Botham home-place, described as follows:

Begins on a beach tree at south of Branch Saluda
River with S. 40° E. 12.50 to a single pine tree;
thence S. 24° E. 7.85 to a rock 3x on the said river, thence
