Beginning at an iron pin on the south side of Cannon Street at corner of lot #1, being 150 feet from Line Street, and running thence S. 0-11 W. 163.4 feet to an iron pin, corner of lot #5; thence N. 66-14 W. 70 feet to Rollins corner; thence with Rollins line N. 3-27 W. 151 feet to an iron pin on Cannon Street; thence with Cannon Street S. 68-25 E. 77.5 feet to the beginning corner.
