in the State aforesaid, the results whereof are hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said J. Z. Cleveland all that gives, parcel or lot of land in Saluda Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina,

No. 1 On the waters of Fall creek bounded by lands, once owned by Samuel Guest,  
J. W. Hightower and others known as the Es' Morgan tract containing one hundred  
and twenty five acres more or less. Recorded March 21st, 1900, Book D, page 177  
Plat made by F. H. Fuller, March 23rd, 1885.

No. 2: Also all that piece, parcel or lot of land in county and state aforesaid on  
the waters of Fall creek and west side of state road in Saluda Township containing  
one hundred twenty five acres more or less.

Less: Seventy eight and  $\frac{1}{2}$  acres more or less sold to J. Z. Cleveland 1828, or 29.

AND J. Z. Cleveland do hereby bind J. Z. Cleveland his heirs, executors and administrators to  
warrant and defend all and singular the said premises unto the said J. Z. Cleveland,  
heirs and assigns, against all and any person or persons lawfully claiming, or to claim, the same, or any part thereof,  
whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to claim, the same, or any part thereof.
