

Know All Men By These Presents,

That the United States Fidelity and Guaranty Company, a body corporate duly incorporated under the laws of the State of Maryland, doth hereby constitute and appoint B. A. Bennett of the City of Greenville, County of Greenville and State of South Carolina to be its true and lawful attorney in and for the Counties of Greenville and Spartanburg in the State of South Carolina for the following purposes, to-wit:
