H. E. Gray, his heirs and assigns,
 My whole and entire undivided interest in and to
 All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land lying being and
 situated in the town of Fountain Inn, County and State aforesaid
 and in Lauren Township, on the east side of Main Street in said
 town, with the following metes and bounds to wit: Beginning at
 a stone corner of building occupied by Marler Brothers as a garage
 running thence along south side of said building in an easterly
 direction 150 feet to an alley, thence along said alley in a north-
 westerly direction 27 1/2 feet to an iron fence, thence at a right
 angle 150 feet to an iron fence on Main Street, thence along Main
 Street 27 1/2 feet to the beginning corner, and being the same
 lot upon which, is situated a 1 story brick store building.
 Bounded on the North by building belonging to Mrs. J.C. McEl-
 formerly used as a shelter, on the east by an alley, on the
 South by building occupied by Marler Brothers as a garage
