Thereafter, by subsequent conveyance the said Janie K. Vaugnan became the owner of the said land and premises by the aforesaid deed of said Greenville Real astate Exchange, and this deed is made by the said Viola F. Thomason and all her children living who are the grantors herein, to confirm the title by a quit-claim deed to the said Janie K. Vaugnan, her neirs and assigns.
