Whereas, in the deed to J. P. Whatley a tract of 8- $\frac{1}{2}$ acres was included, but the intention of all parties was that J. P. Whatley and his wife, Grace C. Whatley, should have that part of said tract west of the Laurens Road containing about 2.43 acres.

Now, Therefore,

I, J. P. Whatley,

and in all open by these presents that

do convey to the sum of One (\$1.00)

and the premises

to me J. P. Whatley and Grace C. Whatley.

In the State aforesaid, the said J. P. Whatley, a single man, did grant, bargain, sell and release, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said J. P. Whatley and Grace C. Whatley, their heirs and assigns:

Austin Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina containing about 2.43 acres, lying on the west side of the Laurens Road, in the Town of Mauldin, having the following metes and bounds—

Beginning at a stake on the Greenville and Laurens Road at J. P. Whatley's corner, and running thence S. 32-20 W. 54.7 feet to a stake; thence N. 28 W. 979 feet to a stake; thence N. 76 E. 178 feet to a stake at the road; thence along said road S. 20-30 E. 891 feet to a stake; thence further along the road S. 22 E. 253.8 feet to the beginning corner, and containing two and forty-three one hundredths (2.43) acres, according to a survey of W. J. Riddle, dated December 6, 1934. The intention of this deed is to confirm the title to all the road frontage on the Laurens Road in the tract conveyed to J. P. Whatley by Susan H. Verdin, et al., September 8, 1934, deed recorded in Deed Book 156, page 190, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County.
