All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in Glassy Mountain Township, and containing 361 acres, more or less and having according to a plat of property of Mary Lockman made by H. C. Wilburn, Surveyor, September 1925, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at a mahogany stump 3xn by creek adjoining property formerly belonging to R. This being the same tract of land conveyed to John A. Farr by Mrs. M. E. Lockman by deed dated August 17, 1933, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 174, at page 86, and the same tract of land to which John A. Farr was deeded a one-ninth undivided interest by Hattie Mae Gregg (Hattie Mae Howard) by deed dated October 19, 1934, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 178 at page 241. The deeds from the parties referred to purported to convey two tracts of 182 acres and 82 acres respectively, but upon a survey it was determined that the description of these two tracts actually embraces an area of 361 acres.
