Grace H. Schilletter:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situated, lying and being in Shucks Springs Township, State and County aforesaid, near the town of Greer, S.C. and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin about 100 feet south of the Southern Railway at N. M. Cannon corner, and runs thence south 45.52 East 349 feet to an iron pin; thence North 77.16 East 252 feet to an iron pin on the west side of the Brushy Creek Road; thence north 23.26 East 469 feet along said road; thence North 26.50 East 106 feet; thence North 33.51 East 118 feet; thence North 62.28 East 112.4 feet to an iron pin; thence North 76.40 East 46.3 feet along said Brushy Creek Road to an iron pin; thence <sup>north 15.23 feet</sup> <sub>along Barnes line</sub> <sup>25.5 feet</sup> to an iron pin; thence South 73.38 West 1,712.4 feet along Southern Railway right-of-way to the beginning corner and containing 16.25 acres more or less. Part of the sub-division of the E. A. Wood Estate as per blue print of J. D. Brockman surveyor, under the date of June 22nd, 1935.

Bounded on the north by the Southern Railway, east by the Barnes Estate, south by Brushy Creek Road, and west by C. L. Lee and P. E. Johnson.
