Compton, Rsq., Trustee of the Estate of Interstate Mortgage Company, and naving in said order directed the said Trustee to give notice to creditors and stocknolders of Interstate Mortgage Company, by mailing and publishing as therein provided, of a hearing to be held on September 6, 1934, at the nour and place specified in said order and notice, to determine whether the said appointment should be made permanent, or terminated and said Inter-state Mortgage Company restored to the possession of the property, or if a substituted trustee or trustees or an additional trustee or trustees should be appointed; and the said Trustee having duly given notice of said hearing in accordance with the provisions of said order and due proof thereof having been filed with this Court; and said bearing having been duly held at the said time and place, and Cabell, Ignatius, Lown and Blinken, attorneys for the Trustee, having appeared and moved this Court that the said appointment be made permanent, and no one appearing in opposition thereto, and due deliberation having been had thereon,

Now, on motion of Cabell, Ignatius, Lown and Blinken, Esqs., it is hereby

Ordered:

1. That the said appointment of said George B. Compton, as Trustee of the Estate of Interstate Mortgage Company, is hereby made permanent, and the said George B. Compton as said Trustee shall continue to have and be vested with all the rights, powers, authority and title set forth in the above mentioned order dated August 6, 1934; and

2. That the bond heretofore filed herein by said George B. Compton, pursuant to said order of August 6, 1934, shall be continued and that the said George B. Compton shall not be required to execute or furnish any other bond.
