(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

John H. Davenport, all that certain lot of land situate, lying and being in the City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid, on Mc Bee Boulevard and Arlington Avenue, and being known and designated as a portion of Lot No. 16 in Block "A" as shown on a plat of record in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book A, pages 122-123 and described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin on Arlington Avenue, joint corner of Lots Nos. 15 and 16 and running thence with joint line of said lots 137 feet, more or less, to an iron pin in line of lot of Macken J. Moore; thence with line of Moore's lot in a Northwesterly direction 72 feet to iron pin on Mc Bee Boulevard in center of common driveway; thence along Mc Bee Boulevard and Arlington Avenue 161 feet, more or less, to the beginning corner.

Also all my right, title and interest of, in and to the common driveway situate half upon the above described lot and half upon the lot of Macken J. Moore.

Said property being that conveyed to Hannie H. Davenport by W. S. Pack by deed recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Book of Deeds "87" at Page 553.

The grantee herein assumes and agrees to pay the balance due on the mortgage of Hannie H. Davenport to American Building and Loan Association in the original sum of \$3,600.00 recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Book of Mortgages L13" at Page 262.

It is distinctly understood that as a part of the consideration for this conveyance, the grantor reserves unto herself a life estate with the right to occupy the premises as a home for and during her life.
