of SPRINGWOOD CEMETERY having the following dimensions, to-wit:

North eleven feet, East sixteen and one-half feet, South eleven feet, West sixteen and one-half feet,

for the right of burial and cemetery purposes, and to be used exclusively for the rights and purposes aforesaid, and subject to the conditions of the Charter of said grantor, and all revisions thereof and amendments that may be made thereto, and also subject to the Ordinances of said City, and the rules, regulations and by-laws of the City Council and Cemetery Trustees or Committee, now in force, or which may hereafter be passed, relating to said cemetery and the burial of the dead therein.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said H. J. Skinn

his heirs and assigns forever;

subject, however, to the limitations and conditions hereinbefore imposed.

And it does hereby bind itself and its successors in office to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said

H. J. Skinn, his

heirs and assigns, against itself and its successors in office and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
