All that certain tract of land lying, being and situate in Union County and State aforesaid, containing seven hundred and eight acres, more or less, and bounded by lands of W. W. King, W. T. Beatty + Mrs. Leila B. Jeter, Estate of J. C. Tunaley, Jason M. Kreeer + J. B. Batenbaugh formerly J. M. Kreeer, Sr., Estate of John T. Davis, Mrs. Caroline Humphries, Estate of W. J. Edwards and others. It being the tracts of land purchased by A. T. Foster + F. M. Farr from John Y. Sartor and John Farr and known as the Dunn place. The deed made by J. Y. Sartor will be found in book E. 23, page 322, the one from John Farr will be found in Book B. #25, page 399 and 400 in Clerk's office Union County, S. C. These tracts known as the Dunn place. In 1882 were sold to Geo. Bailey with mortgage to secure debt. 1891 Mr. Bailey died without paying for the land. 1909 foreclosure was enforced against heirs of Geo. Bailey, deceased.
