Cover Street; numbers 33, 34, 29 and 31 fronting on  
Center Street, all of said lots being a part of the  
estate of George W. Taylor, and known as "Junction  
Heights", and being set out on a plat of same by  
Brodie & Bedell, September 11, 1913, said plat recorded  
in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Vol.  
Book "C" page 706, there being the same lots  
conveyed to the South Carolina National Bank of

Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.


