NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Two hundred thirty and no/100 (\$ 230.00) Dollars, to me paid by the said E. H. Edwards

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said E. H. Edwards

"That lot of land on Trohawk Street, (Needmore Section) in or near the town of Greer, Chick Springs Township, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, adjoining lot of Belt Prince, and delineated as follows:

Beginning at the corner of Belt Prince, on Trohawk Street, and runs thence with this street, 58 feet to J. H. Burnett's corner; thence with his line 114 feet; thence at right angles 58 feet to Belt Prince's line; thence with his line 114 feet to the beginning corner, and being a part of the same lot conveyed to Frank Burnett by Lee M.
