Gilstrap all that piece, parcel or tract of land containing 38 1/2 acres, more or less as describe by a plat of J. P. Willis and a later Plat by W. M. Nash Reg. Sur. Sept. 28th, 1836. Same Bounded on North by other land of C. F. Davenport on East by Public road to Greenville by Forksnoals, on South by Belt Sims Sr. on west by Horse Creek or land of Mrs. Kay. Being part of Young Sims land to Obadiah Davenport about 1884. And being part of 81 1/2 acre tract as shown by said Willis plat of 1884.
