All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land in Cleveland Township, County and State aforesaid being the eastern half of Lot No. 36 of a subdivision of D. B. Tripp's land at River Falls, according to plat recorded in Plat Book 1, at page 89, P. M. S. Office for Greenville County and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on other lands of D. B. Tripp, joint corner of lots nos. 36 and 37, and running thence in a northerly direction 117 feet to an iron pin; corner of 30 foot road running from Tripp's land to Gruber's land, thence with said road S. 71° 21' 73" feet to an iron; thence still with said road S. 85° 21' 27" feet to a point; thence in a southerly direction along line of property this day conveyed to Jessie Cantrell Barton to a point in line of Lot no. 37; thence with line of Lot no. 37 in an easterly direction 100 feet to the beginning corner."
