made by A. T. Riddle dated March 1936 and more fully
described as follows:

running thence N. 38-00 E. 2220 feet to a cluster of
cotton oak thence N. 84-45 E. 375 feet to a sweet gum
thence N. 12-10 E. 541 feet to a stake thence N. 88-45 E. 406
feet to a stake thence N. 10-10 E. 327 feet to a stake
thence S. 67-45 E. 270 feet to a stone thence S. 64-45 E.
175 feet to a stake at the creek near the mouth of
a branch running thence up said branch as the
line S. 8-50 E. 400 feet to a bend thence S. 9-30 W. 332
feet to a bend thence S. 28-45 E. 204 feet to a bend
thence S. 40-50 E. 838 feet to bend thence S. 50 E. 210 feet
to an iron post thence S. 41 E. 175 to a poplar stump
thence S. 10-50 E. 152 feet to a stake thence S. 56-30
