WHEREAS, Rena Rice Geer and J. C. Keys, Jr., both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 10th day of April, 1941, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Blythe Shoals Water Works, Inc.,

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to sell water to residents of the Blythe

Shoals section of Greenville County, to buy and sell real estate, to own and operate such machinery as may be deemed necessary or expedient for the operation of a water company and generally to do any and all other acts usually done by water works companies.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Three Thousand (\$3,000.00)

payable \$1,200.00 already paid in, balance payable at option of Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is fifty (50) of the par value of Sixty (\$60.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 8th day of April, 1941 at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

Rena Rice Geer, J. C. Keys, Jr., and B. E. Geer,

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President & Treasurer, B. E. Geer

as Vice-President, Rena Rice Geer; as Secretary, J. C. Keys, Jr.,

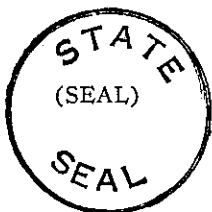
as Treasurer, X

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
