The above mentioned line to be constructed along the McAlhaney road.

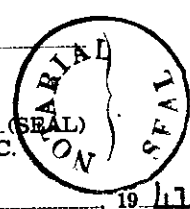

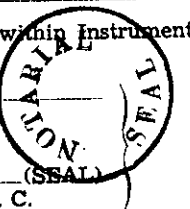
