All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Oaklawn Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

and having the following metes and bounds:

"Beginning at stone on Pine Avenue 2.70 chains from the corner of Pine Avenue and road leading to Pelzer, South Carolina, and running thence S. 20-3/4 W. 7.75 chains to a stone; thence S. 86 W. 4.00 chains to a stone; thence N. 20-3/4 E. 7.75 chains to a stone on Pine Avenue; thence with Pine Avenue N. 86 E. 4.00 chains to the beginning corner, containing Three and 5/100 acres, more or less, and known as Lot No. 26 on a plat of Arden made by Jno.
