(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said
J. C. Walton, his Heirs and assigns forever:

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Fairview.....Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

in the Town of Fountain Inn on the west side of Weston Street, with the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at an iron pin on Weston Street, Southeast corner of lot of the said J. C. Walton, formerly R. L. Cashwell, measuring a distance of 192.6 feet from Quillen Avenue, running thence along said Weston Street S. 37 E. 25 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 42.05 W. 136.4 feet to an iron pin, Southwest corner of Lot of the said J. C. Walton; thence N. 32.15 E. along the Walton line 143.2 feet to the beginning corner on Weston Street. This being a small portion of the same lot of land conveyed to Henry C. Curry, et al deacons of The First Presbyterian Church of Fountain Inn, S. C., by deed of J. W. Putman recorded in the office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County in Deed Book 201, at page 255.
