The inclusion herein of any specific powers shall in no way, manner or form act as a limitation on the general power of attorney herein given.

If the authority contained herein shall be revoked or terminated by operation of law without notice to the attorney named herein, I hereby agree, in consideration of his acting as my attorney pursuant to this power of attorney, to save and hold him harmless from any loss suffered or liability incurred by him in so acting after such revocation or termination without such notice.

It is my intention that any official or nonofficial report or listing of me as "missing in action" as that phrase is used in military parlance, shall not be construed as constituting notice of my death nor operate to revoke this instrument.
