tion of this agreement, that either of the parties hereto shall have the right to obtain a divorce at any time hereafter, and in the event he or she files a petition for said divorce, the other party to this Agreement agrees to accept service of a Bill of Complaint, consent to a Decree of Divorce, and fully cooperate in all respects so that a divorce may be obtained by either party without the contest of the other; provided said action for divorce is based upon legal grounds which do not involve moral turpitude.

4. The parties further mutually agree, and each of them does hereby renounce and relinquish any and all claims which he or she might have in the estate of the other, in case of the death of such other, as heir or distributee, so that upon the death of either the husband or wife named herein, his or her estate shall be distributed in the same manner as though said husband and wife named herein had never been married.

VII.

It is distinctly understood and agreed, and as a part of the consideration for this contract that the wife is to vacate the home at 16 Mt. Vista Avenue, Greenville, South Carolina, within one week from the execution of this agreement.
