Cammer Fromerty as shown by plat thereof recorded in the RIC Office for Greenville County, C. C. in Plat Book "L", page 115; and

VHENEAS, the Second Party is the owner of the let adjecent to that of the First Party which is designated as Lot 47 on the aforestic Flat Book "L", page 115; and

WHEREAS, a fence was erected by a prior owner of the Second Tarty's lot and, as a result of a mistake, said fence was creeted not on the line separating the lots described herein but was placed on a line accrement at the joint front corner of Lots 47 and 48 and running thence or a straight line at a slight angle into Lot 48 until said fence encroached a regimum distance of approximately ten feet into the rear of said lot,

NOW, THERIFORE, for and in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars to each party in hand paid the other, receipt whereof is here's acknowledge, the parties hereto do hereby agree as follows:

- (1) The First Party agrees that the fence shall remain as it is now located until such time as they desire the removal thereof.
- (2) The Second Party agrees that the location of the fence on the property of the First Party is by permission of the First Party and ic not adverse, nor shall the continued use thereof create in the Second Party, her successors, heirs, or assigns, any right by prescription or any right arising out of adverse possession but to the contrary is remissive in nature.
