KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that I, RUTH E. CHAPMAN,
in consideration of a one-half (½) portion of the purchase price paid
me in land and before the selling of the same by Frank A.
Richardson (receipt which he is hereby acknowledged),
my son F. A., remained, sold, released, and by these presents do
hereby, bargain, sell and release unto the said FRANK A. RICHARDSON AND
LILLIE L. RICHARDSON, their heirs and assigns, forever, the following
described land:

"All that lot of land on Parker Road in Greenville County, South Carolina,
being a portion of Lots Nos. 300, 301, 302, 303 and 304 as shown on a plat
of property of Colonial Company recorded in Plat Book "J", at page 190, in
the R.R.C. Office for Greenville County and being all of the property
situated South of Ianston Creek between Parker and Franklin Roads, being
bounded on the North by property of F. A. and Lillie Richardson, on the
West by property of Epps, on the South by property of Trainor, Cromer,
Minor, Martin and Garrett (said adjoining owners being either present
owners or former owners), on the East by Lot No. 305 of the Colonial Company
property, all by Parker Road, which is owned by the heirs of L. T. Chapman,
and having the following lines and bounds:

BEGINNING at a pin on the line of Lot No. 300 according to the plat of
Colonial Company at the North Western corner of the land, bounded to F. J.
Trainor by deed recorded in Vol. 432, at page 137 in the Greenville County
R.R.C. Office, which pin is 200 feet North of Franklin Road, and running thence
with the line of Lot No. 300, along property formerly owned by Epps and
now owned by Epps, N. 25-27 E., 373.3 feet, more or less, to a pin at the
corner of the F. A. and Lillie Richardson property, which property is that
conveyed by deed recorded in said R.R.C. Office in Vol. 453, at page 365; thence
with said Richardson property the following courses and distances (see plat
of S. C. Jones, recorded in Plat Book "H", page 17): S. 63-05 E., 211 feet,
S. 26-23 E., 67 feet, S. 63-31 E., 175 feet, S. 86-45 E., 104 feet, S. 81-10
E., 12 feet, N. 3-50 E., 112 feet, and N. 87-05 E., 42.6 feet to a pin in the
center of a bridge on Parker Road crossing Ianston Creek; thence with center
of road along said center such distance as may be contiguous to Lot No. 304
of the property of Colonial Company, and so far as to differ, to said Lot No.
304 of Colonial Company were said road discontinued; thence across said road
to a pin on the western side of Parker Road, joint corner of Lots Nos. 304
and 305 according to said Colonial Company plat; thence with the line of
Lot No. 304, 279.5 feet, more or less, to a pin at the corner of the property
conveyed to K. G. Lee Garrett by deed recorded in Vol. 248, page 39, which
pin is 215 feet from Franklin Road; thence with Garrett line N. 31-06 E.,
104 feet to a pin on line of Lots Nos. 303 and 304; thence with line of Lot
No. 303 (which also line of lot conveyed to F. L. Price by deed recorded in
Vol. 341, page 141), N. 25-34 E., 15 feet to a pin at the rear corner of
