Beginning at a stake on line of Mrs. Shuler's land, and running thence N. 58.58 W. 138 feet to a stake; thence N. 12.58 W. 195 feet to a stake; thence N. 13.43 W. 128 feet to a stake; thence N. 17.18 W. 164 feet to a stake; thence N. 3.43 W. 158 feet to a stake; thence N. 18.22 E. 134 feet to a stake; thence N. 15.47 E. 147 feet to a stake on south side of road; thence along said road, S. 56.30 W. 290 feet to a stake, corner of Kemp land; thence along line of same, S. 14.30 E. 240 feet to a stake, and S. 1.15 E. 330 feet to a stake, and S. 14.45 E. 209 feet to a stake, and S. 2.30 W. 160 feet to a stake; thence N. 66.30 E. 218 feet to a stake; thence N. 73.15 E. 106 feet to the beginning corner.

It is understood and agreed that the described property, along with other parcels on South Tyger River, is to be used by the Commission of Public Works for a water shed and reservoir for the City of Greer. The seller herein, as long as he owns the adjoining tract from which the above described tract is conveyed, or the subsequent owners of the same, shall have the following rights and privileges, but subject to the following restrictions:

- 1. To pasture to the water line, or to cultivate crops to the high water mark in flood season; to withdraw water for irrigation purposes when the same is available, subject to State laws and regulations.
- 2. To fish in the waters of the reservoir, subject to the laws of the State and the rules of the S.C. Fish and Game Commission and the rules of the Commission of Public Works.
