

NOW, Therefore, Know all men by these Presents, that I, E. Inman, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One Thousand and no/100-----

to me paid by the said Bank of Travelers Rest

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Bank of Travelers Rest

All that piece, parcel or tract of land in Cleveland Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, bounded by Sap Creek Road, Brooks Road, and lands of Thomasson and Tankersley, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEING on a walnut tree in the Sap Creek Road, at its intersection with the Brooks Road, and running thence in a westerly direction down the center of the said Brooks Road to point, joint corner with tract of land conveyed by me to John Thomasson by deed; thence in a southerly direction along line of the said last mentioned Thomasson property to a point, joint corner with Thomasson and Tankersley; thence in an easterly direction, with the line of the Tankersley land, to Sap Creek Road at 24-mile post; thence in a northerly direction to center of the said Sap Creek Road, to the beginning corner; or containing eight (8) acres, more or less."

This is the same property conveyed to John Johnson by E. Inman by deed, dated Feb. 3, 1944, recorded in Vol. 200 at page 307 in the Public Office for Greenville County, and a part of same shown by survey made by J. W. Foster, L. S. May 30, 1944.

There is located on the above described property a three-room frame residence, and other improvements.
