



released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto Lewis C. Ladd,
his heirs and assigns forever

All those two lots of land in Greenville County, S.C. I own, located in the Oak Crest and on the north east side of Linmarst Drive, known as lot 12a and 12c of Section III of Oak Crest, a subdivision of lot 1, Section 13, Township 30 S. & R. 30 E., Greenville, S.C., on January 1, 1958, I do, having, according to said lot, the following notes :

Those lots are subject to the restrictions imposed by Section 22 of the Act, which restrictions are recorded in the Franklin County R.R.C. Office in Vol. 526, at page 413 and Vol. 527, at page 473. This is a portion of the original conveyance from Mrs. B. George J. FOWLER, at First Street, at the corner of Main Street, at 25. It consists of Charles ... LOMAS and H. ...
