TO WIT:

"All that parcel of land known as a portion of Lot 3 of the H.L. Batson estate, situate and lying in Greenville, County S. C., described on a plat by Madison H. Woodward July 1, 1955 and having the following notes and bounds:

Beginning at an iron pin on Paris Mountain Road (S.C. 1.0. B. 291) and running N 41-00E, 139.0' to an iron pin, thence 150-00E, 100.0' to an iron pin; thence S42-00E, 102.8' to an iron pin; thence S-79-10E 46.2' to an iron pin on Paris Mountain Road thence along Paris Mountain Road S 52-36 E 125.0' to point of beginning, the same being a portion of the same parcel of land conveyed by H.L.
