(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by
these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Lucille L. Justice

One-half undivided interest in and to

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Paris Mountain Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina, being known as Lot #1, of a subdivision
known as New Furman Heights, and being more particularly described
according to plat recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville
County in Plat Book "EE", page 75, as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Southern side of Longforest Drive,
which iron pin is at the joint front corner of lots #1 and #18,
and running thence along the line of said lots S. 25-00 W. 117.5
feet to an iron pin at the joint rear corner of lots 1, 2, 3 and
18, running thence along the lines of lots #1 and #2, S. 73-44 E.
170 feet to an iron pin on the Western side of Old Buncombe Road,
running thence along the Western side of Old Buncombe Road,
N. 20-06 E. 92.7 feet to an iron pin at the intersection of Old
Buncombe Road and Longforest Drive, running thence along the
Southern side of Longforest Drive N. 65-00 W. 161.0 feet to an
iron pin, point of beginning.

The above being a portion of the property conveyed to Paul H. (Paul J.)
Justice by Leslie & Shaw, Inc. by deed dated January 18, 1956, and
recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Vol. 543,
page 343.

This is the same property conveyed to grantor herein by Leslie &

and should have been Paul H. Justice.
