1. All that piece, percel or lot of land in Saluda Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on North Saluda River and being known and designated as Tract No. 4 as shown on plat made by W. J. Riddle, Surveyor, July, 1937, and having the following metes and bounds according to said plat, to wit:

BEGINNING at a stake on DuBose Hightower on Saluda River and running thence with the Saluda River as the line the following courses and distances, to wit: N. 40-45 E., 245 feet; N. 17-15 W., 109 feet; N. 0-30 E., 208 feet; N. 39-30 E., 560 feet; N. 35-30 E., 266 feet; N. 48-30 E., 245 feet; N. 20 W., 122 feet; N. 74-30 E., 212 feet; S. 76-15 E., 490 feet to a stake on the river, corner of E. R. Parler land; thence with said line, S. 12-45 E., 1,965 feet to a stone, corner of Saluda Land & Lumber Co.; thence S. 77 W., 1,047 feet to stake; thence N. 44 W., 212 feet to a stone; thence S. 86 W., 554 feet to a stone; thence N. 15-30 M., 670 feet to the beginning corner, and adjoining E.
