All that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, within the corporate limits of the City of Greenville, known and designated as the eastern portion of Lot 89 and all of Lot No. 90 of Plat No. 2 of the property of Overbrook Land Company and Woodville Investment Company made by R. E. Dalton, Engineer, recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Plat Book H, at page 258 and being more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point on the southwest side of Lowndes Hill Road, the center of the northeastern boundary of Lot No. 89, and running thence along a straight line in a southwesterly direction to a point, the center of the southwestern boundary of said lot; thence S. 75-54 E. 79 feet, more or less, to an iron pin; thence N. 35-36 E. 161.5 feet, more or less, to an iron pin on the southwest side of said road; thence N. 30-30 W. 60 feet to a point, the front corner of Lots Nos. 89 and 90; thence N. 28-40 W. 30 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning; being the same conveyed to me by Ruth R.
