KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Mountain Lake Colonies, incorporated under the laws of South Carolina, has agreed to sell to Sidney M. Wilson, his heirs and assigns, the following described property:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, lying and being on the northeasterly side of Lake Drive, in the northern part of the County aforesaid, and being shown as the northwesterly one-half of Lot 16 on the plat of the property of Mountain Lake Colonies made by Dalton & Neves, April, 1926, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Plat Book "D", pages 236 and 237, and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the northeasterly side of Lake Drive, joint front corner of Lots 15 and 16, and running thence S 49-00 E 50 feet to a point, being the center of the front line of Lot 16; thence through the center of Lot 16 in a northeasterly direction 193 feet, more or less, to the center of the rear line of Lot 16; thence along the rear line of Lot 16, N 43-00 W 40 feet to an iron pin, joint rear corner of Lots 15 and 16; thence along the common line of said lots S 63-30 W 208 feet to the point of beginning.
