




County, State of South Carolina on the southern side of Davidson Road near the City of Greenville, and containing 2.66 acres, more or less, and described as follows:

BEGINNING at a stake on the Southern side of Davidson Road and running thence S. 8-15 E. 572 feet to a stake; thence N. 65 W. 200 feet to a stake; thence N. 12-15 W. 454 feet to a stake on Davidson Road; thence with the Southern side of said road, N. 73-35 E. 100 feet, N. 82-35 E. 100 feet and thence 10 feet to the beginning corner.
