

BEGINNING at a red oak in the gap of the mountain at James and Peter Gosnell's corner; running thence S.E. until it strikes the Dark Hollow Branch to a stake; thence nearly East up the said branch to a stake on the old (Baker) line; thence with said Baker line nearly North to a stake with said Baker line; thence with the Baker and James Gosnell's lines to the beginning corner.

(31) That tract in Glassy Mountain Township on Ballew's Mill Creek, containing 285 acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, according to a plat thereof prepared by R. E. Johnston, Surveyor, on February 25, 1904:

BEGINNING at a stake on said Bellew's Mill Creek and running thence N. $62\frac{1}{2}$ E., along said line of land sold to R. E. Johnston by Frances M. Gosnell (see Deed Book JJJ, page 895), in the aforesaid office) 10.87 chains to a stone (which stands 2.18 chains from a fallen poplar; thence S. $83^{\circ} 48'$ E., 11.53 chains to a chestnut oak (down) with pointer; thence N. 77 E., 32.35 chains to a small maple beginning (in place of old maple. Shown on the F. M. Gosnell plat and Deed); thence S. 30 E., 12.40 chains to a stake; thence N. $81\frac{1}{2}$ E., 18.09 chains to a chestnut oak; thence S. $3 14'$ E. 13.30 chains to a stone, in place of locust O.M. and N.M.; thence S. 57 E., 644 chains to two pines (down) with pointers; thence S. 44 degrees $22'$ E., 37.06 chains to a chestnut stump, with pointers; thence S. $59 \frac{1}{3}$ W., 12.04 chains (crossing a small branch) to a chestnut (down) thence N. 56-52 W., 20.24 chains to a chestnut (down); thence S. $87\frac{1}{2}$ W., (crossing three small branches) 27.42 chains to a chestnut (down); thence a straight line, in a general Southwesternly course, about 4.00 chains to a stake on said Bellew's Mill Creek; thence up the said creek to the beginning corner.

(32) That tract in Saluda Township, containing 70 acres, more or less, having the following metes and bounds according to a Plat of James G. Gibbs, dated May 4, 1893:

BEGINNING at a large poplar on State line between North and South Carolina, running thence a little East of South about 15 chains to a persimmon 3x; thence 72 W., 21.36 chains to a hickory 3x; thence N. 87 N. 12.80 chains to a white oak 3x on Sink Hole branch; thence a little East of South about 20.50 chains to a stake; thence S. 76 E., 12.50 chains to a stake; thence N. 34 E., 42.30 chains to a stake; thence N. 68 E., 5.30 chains to a stake on the North and South Carolina State line; thence along said State line N. 70 W., 15.45 chains to the beginning corner.

(33) That tract in Saluda Township containing 332 acres, more or less, being the same property conveyed to R. E. Johnston by Deeds recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Deed Volume NNN, page 215, and KKK, page 122, less that property conveyed to Mrs. Mary C. Hightower by Deed dated October 20, 1904, and recorded in the RMC Office on April 5, 1905.

(34) That tract in Glassy Mountain Township on both sides of South Pacolet River, containing 97 acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, according to a plat thereof prepared by Will D. Neves, Surveyor, bearing date June 15, 1904:

BEGINNING at a poplar 3XOM (down) on the North bank of Pacolet River, and running thence N. $7\frac{1}{2}$ E. up the said branch following the meanders thereof to a poplar 3XOM at the West end of Round Rock; thence S. 54 W. 38.50 chains to a chestnut oak 3xom (gone); thence S. $50\frac{1}{2}$ E. 2.00 chains to a stake 3X in old road; thence S. $44\frac{1}{2}$ E., 2.00 chains to stake 3x in old road; thence S. $88\frac{1}{2}$ E. 2.50 chains to stake 3X; thence N. 67 E.
