

(38) That tract in Glassy Mountain Township, on the headwaters of Vaughn's Creek of South Pacolet River, containing 208 acres, more or less, and described as follows:

BEGINNING on a pine and running thence Southeast to a maple; thence East to a chestnut; thence Southwest to a pine on the Old Bolton line; thence with the said line to a pine; thence North to a chestnut; thence North to the beginning corner.

(39) That tract in Glassy Mountain Township near Vaughn's Gap on the head waters of North Saluda River, containing 106 acres, more or less, having the following metes and bounds, according to a plat thereof prepared by Will D. Neves, Surveyor, bearing date August 3, 1904:

BEGINNING at a poplar 3xom and running thence S. $2\frac{1}{2}$ W., along line of W. C. Lindsay land 39.00 chains to a stake 3xom; thence N. $61\frac{1}{2}$ E., 10.00 chains to a hickory 3xom; thence S. $60\frac{1}{2}$ E., 14.00 chains to a chestnut 3xom; thence N. $56\frac{1}{2}$ E., 24.00 chains to a forked chestnut in place of a hickory; thence S. $78\frac{1}{2}$ E. 5.00 chains to a Spanish oak (gone) 3xom; thence N. $78\frac{1}{2}$ E., 9.00 chains to a pine; 3xom; thence N. $11\frac{3}{4}$ W., along the line of the Covan Mills land 18.00 chains to a pine 3xom; thence N. $87\frac{1}{2}$ W. 7.50 chains to a chestnut 3xom; thence S. 80 W., 36.50 chains to the beginning corner.

(40) That tract in Glassy Mountain Township on the waters of North Saluda River, containing 140 acres, more or less, being described as follows:

BEGINNING on a chestnut tree and running thence to John Plumley's line; thence nearly South to a hickory; thence nearly West to a poplar; thence to a sourwood; the dividing line between lands of William Howard and Decatur Howard; thence to a rock in the road; thence to the wagon road; thence with said road to the beginning corner.

(41) That tract in Glassy Mountain Township, on the head waters of South Pacolet River, containing 50 acres, more or less, and described as follows:

BEGINNING on the "Old Wheelers hickory" 3xom (now down), and running thence nearly East to a walnut 3x; thence $4\frac{3}{4}$ E. 20.00 chains to a chestnut 3xom (down); thence nearly West with the line of the Wm. and Decatur Howard land to a stone 3x; thence nearly Southeast to the beginning corner.

(42) That tract of land conveyed to R. E. Johnston by C. A. Gosnell by deed dated July 18, 1905, recorded in Deed Volume 000, at page 366, RMC Office, Greenville County, S. C., containing 36 acres, more or less.

(43) All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, in Saluda River Township, on Brady's Branch of North Saluda River, containing 161 acres, more or less, having the following metes and bounds according to a plat of Will D. Neves, bearing date July 17, 1905, to wit:

BEGINNING at a maple 3xom on Brady Branch, and running thence due West (crossing Fuller Mountain Road) 39.00 chains along line of J. E. Johnston to a stone 3xom; thence S. $5\frac{1}{2}$ W.
