Bayne in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said W. H. Bayne, his heirs and assigns forever; all our right, title and interest in and to the following described real estate:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Saluda Township on the south side of the Buncombe Road, containing 24 acres, more or less, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a stone on the Buncombe Road and running thence S. 72-00 W. 1138 feet to a stone; thence S. 57-30 W. 1320 feet to a stake; thence S. 2-00 W. 256 feet to the W. B. Allen corner; thence N. 72-00 E. 2475 feet to a stone in the old Buncombe Road; thence with the old Buncombe Road as the line, S. 10-00 E. 330 feet to an iron pin in the old road; thence N. 88-00 E. 183 feet to a pin on the south shoulder of the road; thence with the road as the line, N. 31-41 W. 175 feet to a bend in the road; thence N. 22-10 W. 100 feet to a bend in the road; thence N. 15-45 W. 634 feet to a stone, the beginning corner; less, however, approximately 2.1 acres which was conveyed by the grantee herein to Edgar McDowell, et. al., by deed dated September 24, 1925 and recorded in the R. The above described property is the greater portion of the same conveyed to the grantee herein by W. G. Bayne by deed recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 535, at page 191.

The purpose of this deed is to correct errors in a deed from B. F. Staton, et. al., to James Taylor, et. al., which is recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 304, at page 68. Since the execution of that deed, R. P. Staton has died intestate, and his only surviving heirs-at-law are included among the grantors herein. The children of Lillie Taylor, a deceased daughter of the said T. M. Staton, are not included in this conveyance for the reason that they acquired title to the property and subsequently conveyed it by proper deeds.
