Blankenbush and Lawrence Austin Richardson, all of which will more fully appear by reference to the records in the Office of the Probate Court for Richland County, South Carolina. Graves W. Richardson thereafter conveyed to the grantor, Lawrence A. Richardson, his interest in the above property by deed dated January 16, 1963, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Deed Book 711, Page 267.
