

subsequently executed a quit claim deed to Paul Wickliffe, W. S. Batson, Allen League, Homer Styles Joe Coleman, as Trustees of The Travelers Rest, S.C. Lions Club, in which he expressly released to them all his interest by way of right of reverter or otherwise, which he might hold in the subject premises. This latter deed was dated July 30, 1958 and recorded August 1, 1958 in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S.C. in Deed Volume 603 at Page 148. Allen League subsequently moved from the State of South Carolina and resigned his Trusteeship, and no successor was named to replace him in this capacity. A portion of the premises conveyed by the two deeds above referred to was purportedly conveyed by The Travelers Rest Lions Club, Pres., V. Pres., Sec. to Homer Styles by deed dated January 11, 1960 and recorded July 8, 1960 in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S.C. in Deed Volume 654 at Page 203. The premises purportedly conveyed by this latter deed are the same above described in this present quit claim deed. Subsequently, Homer Styles conveyed said premises to H. N. Forrest and Pauline H. Forrest by deed dated May 24, 1965 and recorded June 18, 1965 in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S.C. in Deed Volume 776 at Page 19. Inasmuch as there is some question as to the correctness of the form of the conveyance from Travelers Rest Lions Club., Pres., V. Pres., Sec. to Homer Styles above referred to, this present instrument is hereby executed as a corrective, as well as, quit claim deed pursuant to proper resolution of the membership of Travelers Rest Lions Club.
