Smith, Glenn Henson, Bobby Dean by (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Monarch H. Hawkins, fattie Ethel H. Ross, Glenn Henson, Bobb Dean Tenson, Lewis menson and Sallie !!. Smith, and their heirs and assigns forever: ALL OUR RIGHT, TITLE AND INTEREST IN AND TO: Township, Greenville Highland all that piece, parcel or lot of land in County, State of South Carolina, on the north side of State Highway No. 414 (Turaloo Road), near Liberty Methodist Church and having courses and distances according to a survey and plat of the property of Claude and Clyde Henson Estates by U. F. Millis, Engineers, dated June 11, 1968, as follows, to-wit:

BEGINFING at a nail in the center of the highway, corner of the Clyde Henson tract, iron pin on north bank at 35 feet, and running thence along the Clyde Henson tract, N. 0-10 E. 772 feet and N. 28-25 E. 1864 feet to the center of Middle Tyger River, iron pin back on line at 28 feet; thence down said river as the line to the corner of the reaf H.
