(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said John E. Davis, and to his heirs and assigns,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Graceland Cemetery Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, being known and designated as Lots #581 and #582 in Section No. 8, and containing 200 square feet each, more or less, the same being better described and designated, in accordance with a map on file in the office of the Greenville Cemetery Association

It is distinctly understood that said lots are to be used exclusively for the burial of human bodies of the white race, and said lots are sold and conveyed subject to all rules and regulations appearing of record, including the rules and regulations as are shown in that certain deed recorded on January 24, 1927 in Vol. 80 Record of Deeds, at Page 189, in the office of the Register of Mense Conveyances of Greenville County, South Carolina.



This deed is executed by the grantors above named for the purpose of conveying all of the right, title and interest of Lesley Lee Whyte, now deceased, in and to the above described cemetery lots unto the said John E. Davis, and to his heirs and assigns forever, the said Lesley Lee Whyte having died intestate a resident of Pinellas County, Florida, on October 28, 1955, leaving as her surviving next-of-kin and sole heirs-at-law the said Lesley Stalker Callahan, William L. Stalker, John R. Stalker and Sheila Stalker Lozo.
