This Indenture this Eighteenth day of August in the year of our Lord one Thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Eight and in the thirteenth year of American Independence Between Reuben Stringer of Greenville County State of

South Carolina of the one part, and Joseph Sowel of the State and County aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Reuben Stringer for and in consideration of the sum of forty pounds Sterling to him in hand paid by the said Reuben Stringer the Receipt whereof is hereby fully Acknowledged he the said Reuben Stringer hath Granted Relinquish and sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth Grant, Remain, and Sell alien and confirm unto the said Joseph Sowel his heirs and assigns forever all that plantation or Tract of Land situate Lyinn and being on a branch of the Grove Creek the waters of Saluda River containing two hundred acres be the same more or less, Bounded Northward by James Blasingames lane and westward by other Land of the said Reuben Stringer and on all other sides by Vacant Land when Run. Granted to the said Reuben Stringer the fiftenth day of October one Thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Seven and Recorded in the Secretarys Office in Grant book B. B.
