South Carolina Greenville County February the Seventeenth One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Nine A Deed of conveyance for two hundred and forty acres of land from William Brasure to John Mitchem (being proved before a magistrate) and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made the twenty fourth day of August in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Eight Between William Brasure of the State of North Carolina of the one part, and John Mitchem of the State of South Carolina of the other part, Witnesseth that the said William Brasure for and in consideration of the sum of thirty pounds Sterling current money to him in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the said John Mitchem the receipt whereof the said William Brasure doth here by acknowledge and thereof and of and from every part and parcel thereof do acquit and discharge the said John Mitchem his heirs and assigns and for divers other good causes and considerations hereunto moving have granted bargained sold, Aliened, Enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell Enfeoff and confirm unto the said John Mitchem his heirs and assigns for ever All that plantation or tract of land situate in Greenville County in the said State of South Carolina on Reedy fork waters of Peag River containing two hundred and forty acres, Originally granted to the said William Brasure on the fourth day of December One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Six by his Excellency William Moultrie Esquire Governor and commander in chief of the said State, having such shape form marks bulking and boundings as appears by a plat thereof annexed to the Original grant Together with all and singular the Houses out-houses, ways, waters, paths, passages, Trees Fences, Enclosures, Hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said plantation or tract of land belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof and all the Estate right, Title Interest claim and demand whatsoever both in law and Equity of the said William Brasure of in and to the said premises and of in and to every part and parcel thereof have and to hold the said plantation or tract of land containing two hundred and forty acres more or less and all and singular other the premises above mentioned with the appurtenances unto the said John Mitchem his heirs and assigns to the only use and behoof of him the said John Mitchem his heirs and assigns forever. In Witness whereof the said William Brasure for himself and his heirs the said plantation or tract of land and all and singular the premises above mentioned with the appurtenances
