This Indenture made the Sixteenth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Nine, and of the Independence of the United States of North America the Thirteenth, Between Thomas Lewis of Greenville County and State of South Carolina of the one part, and Solomon Littleton of the County and State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Thomas Lewis for and in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds Sterling to him the said Thomas Lewis in hand paid by the said Solomon Littleton the receipt whereof the said Thomas Lewis doth hereby acknowledge. That the said Thomas Lewis hath granted bargained, and sold Alarmed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain, and sell, All, and confirm unto the said Solomon Littleton his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcell of land containing by computation fifty acres (be the same more or less) Situate in the County aforesaid on Saluda River, Beginning on a Hollow on Saluda River and running thence N E 15° 30' Chains to a branch, thence down the said branch to Saluda River, thence up the said River to the beginning, it being part of a tract of land containing two hundred acres granted to James Gore the fourth day of July One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty five under the hand of his Excellency William Moultrie Esquire Governor and commander in chief and recorded in the Secretarys office grant book B.B. page 288 reference therunto hand will more fully appear, and conveyed by the said James Gore unto the said Thomas Lewis by a Deed of conveyance bearing date the tenth day of July 1788 - and also all Trees Woods under woods, Rites, Commons, Common of pasture profits commodities Advantages, Hereditaments ways waters and appurtenances whatsoever to the said messenger or Tenant in the premises.
