South Carolina Greenville County August the seventeenth One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Nine, A Deed of conveyance for one hundred and twenty acres of land from Charles Sullewnt to Samuel Deweast, Acknowledged by the said Charles Sullewnt in open court and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made the eighth day of August and in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Nine, and in the thirtieth year of American Independence Between Charles Sullewnt of the State of South Carolina and Ninety six district of the one part, and Samuel Deweast of the said State and District of the other part, Witnesses that the said Charles Sullewnt for and in consideration of the sum of five pounds Sterling money to him in hand paid by the said Samuel Deweast at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof he the said Charles Sullewnt doth hereby acknowledge and from every part and parcel thereof do acquit and discharge the said Samuel Deweast him and his heirs and assigns and for divers other good causes and considerations hereunto moving have granted, bargained, sold, aliened conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do grant, bargain, convey and confirm unto the said Samuel Deweast his heirs and assigns forever a parcel or tract of land lying in the district of Ninety six and on a branch of horse Creek of Reedy River originally granted to the said Charles Sullewnt on the first day of May 1786 or by a plot thereunto annexed will fully appear one hundred and twenty acres be the same more or less Together with all and singular the Houses, out-houses, ways, waters, paths, passages, trees, Fences, easements, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said parcel or tract of land or in anywise appertaining and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents issues and profits thereof and every part and parcel thereof and all the estate right, title, interest, claim and demand whatsoever both in law and equity of the said Charles Sullewnt of, in and to the said premises and of in and to
