Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Michael Purkle hath in consideration of the sum of thirty pounds Sterling to him in hand will and truly paid by the said James Sampford the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. He the said Michael Purkle hath bargained sold remised conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien remise release convey and confirm unto the said James Sampford in his actual possession now being by virtue of a bargain and sale to him thereof made for one whole year and by force of the Statute for transferring uses into possession and to his heirs and assigns forever one hundred acres of land more or less being part of the above mentioned tract of two hundred acres, laid out unto the said James Sampford as follows, beginning on a red oak which stands in the line of the above mentioned tract of two hundred acres on the bank of said Reedy River from thence running N E 50° on the said line to the corner on a post oak from thence running N W 40° to Hugh Roarks line, from thence running on the said Hugh Roarks line to the said Reedy River from thence bounding on the said Reedy River down to the beginning including one hundred acres of land more or less, together with all land, buildings, houses, outhouses, edifices, barns, stables, yards, gardens, orchards, trees, wood and underwood, timber and timber trees, meadows, pastures, ponds, lakes, fishings, ways, water and water courses, paths, passages, liberties, privileges, profits, hereditaments, rights, members and appurtenances whatsoever thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversion or reversions remainder and remainders rents, issues and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said tract of one hundred acres of land more or less as aforesaid with every of the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said James Sampford his heirs and assigns forever in free and common socage to the only proper use and behoof of him the said James Sampford his heirs and assigns and the said James Sampford shall and may from time to time and at all times hereafter peaceably have hold use occupy possess and enjoy the said tract or plantation of one hundred acres of land as aforesaid without any manner of trouble him, damage, molestation, interruption or denial of him the said Michael Purkle his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns and of all and every other person or persons whatsoever.
